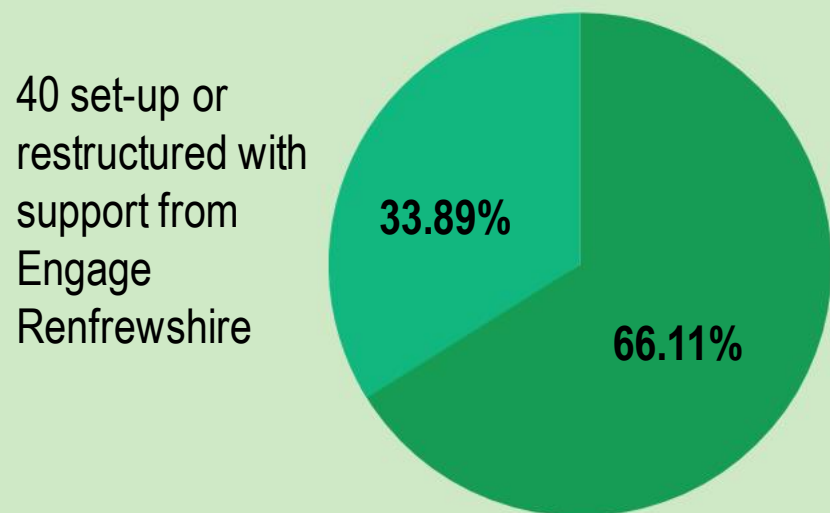

Support for RenSEN

Across the RenSEN membership, Engage Renfrewshire has supported the sector to develop and grow through a range of targeted support activities including

- Preparation for the social enterprise journey – through Engage Renfrewshire’s Toolkit for Social Enterprise
- Knowledge Building – through participation in training sessions and seminars.
- Business Capacity –strengthening business systems and procedures e.g. Human Resource, Governance, and Finance (incl. payroll)
- Business modelling - developing product/service, tender readiness, registering with regulators and HMRC
- Signposting – specialist one to one sector support and investment e.g. business planning, marketing strategies, local and national sources of grant funding and investment
